Brofile: Donald H George, Turtle Name 'Jawge', Class of 1959

Jawge was born and raised in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and graduated from Shorewood High School in 1952. He attended Carthage College primarily because of Alan Anderson, Carthage representative for Lutheran students.

In the fall of 1953, Jawge went to Carl Rosessler's "The Chief's" room and found an unusual looking emblem on his mirror. That was the first time the TEX insignia was formed, and has not changed over the years. His roommates at Carthage were Larry Crone, Maurice Felton, Jerry Johnson, Carl Rosessler and Bill Trees, all of whom where founders of the Turtles.

Jawge recalled that while at Carthage, the Turtles had a BBQ near the Carthage Golf Course, and after many beverages, Ace Henderson went on the golf course and changed every flag on every hole. Jawge's two trips with the Turtles to Anna, Illinois brought back fond memories of the Turtles' travels, among others.

After college, Jawge served in the US Army, stationed in Orleans, France, in the Communications Center. While in the army, he traveled extensively through Europe.

After graduation, Jawge was hired by Allen-Bradley Co., now 'Rockwell International', and enrolled in their electrical engineering program. He spent 6 years in Milwaukee and then transferred top Cincinnati, where he met and married his wife Janet. They built a home only to have it destroyed by the 1974 tornado. He retired after 37 years and moved to Gaylord, Michigan, 50 miles south of Mackinac Island, where they enjoy golf, fishing and traveling.

He and his wife have two daughters, Tricia and Tanya and son Daryl, and 5 grandchildren.
